When printing this pattern it is important to print it full size. When you bring up the print dialog box look in the "Page Sizing & Handling" section. Make sure the "Actual Size" is selected before you hit print.


You also only need to print the page/s you need. After the print dialog opens look for the "Pages to Print" section. You can print the current page or a range of pages. This will help save ink by not printing the title/instruction pages.

Compound Cut Puzzle Block



Notice that the middle tabs get cut away. This is normal.

The puzzle has 12 compound cut pieces.



This puzzle needs accurate 90 degree cuts or it will not slide apart easily. Use a sharp blade and let the blade do the cutting. Don't force the cut or you will end up will bowed or slanted cuts.

The finished puzzle is somewhat fragile. It will not hold up to rough handling. It is more of a novelty than a child toy.



Wrap the pattern around a 1.5" X 1.5" X 4.25" Block covered with blue painters tape.

I find it easier to use my compound cut jig to hold the block while I make the cuts.





Cut side one then flip the piece to prepare to cut side two.






Remove the block from the jig and carefully dissamble the waste pieces from the block






You will eventually get down to the puzzle. Some of the cut away center tabs will still be in the puzzle at this point. They wall fall out as you disassemble the puzzle.





These pieces will fall out as you take the blok apart. This is normal.



These small tabs will need to be sanded away to make the puzzle easier to slid apart.
