When printing this pattern it is important to print it full size. When you bring up the print dialog box look in the “Page Sizing & Handling” section. Make sure the “Actual Size” is selected before you hit print.

You also only need to print the page/s you need. After the print dialog opens look for the “Pages to Print” section. You can print the current page or a range of pages. This will help save ink by not printing the title/instruction pages.

Printing Instructions





Bench top saw horses. For finishing or holding.
Optional nail inserts for no more bottom finish drying





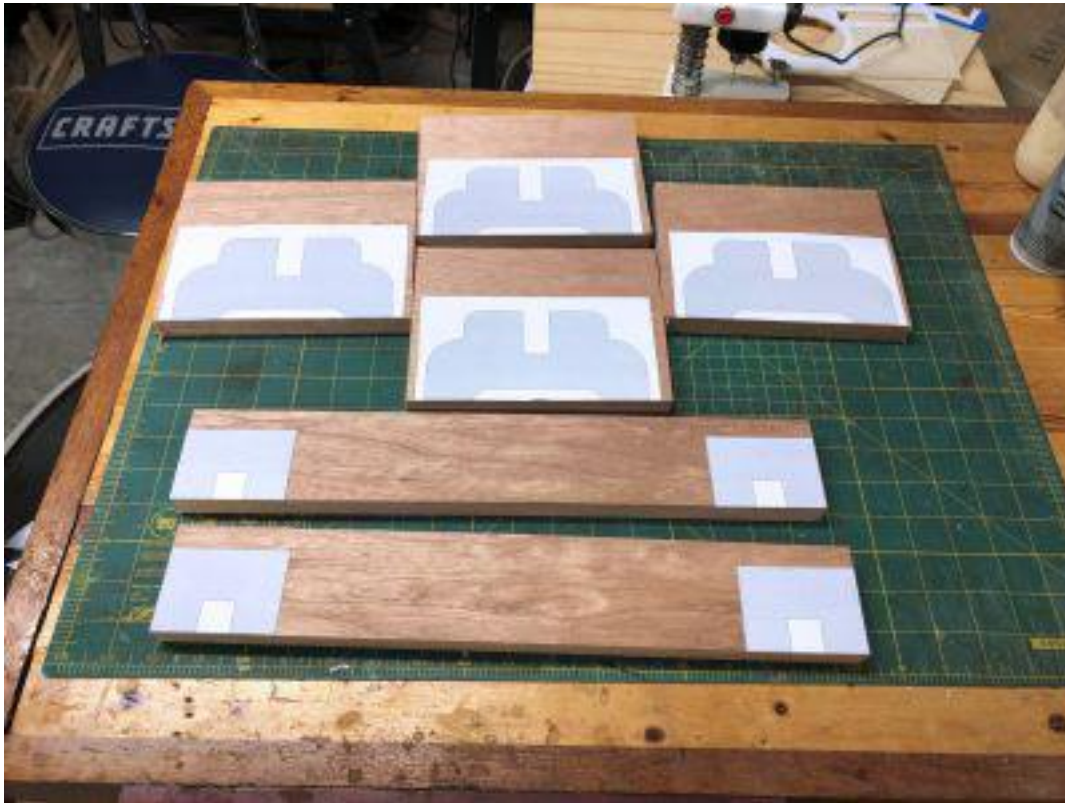
Pre-drill and insert cut off nails for holding piece off the top of the bench top saw horses. Great for painting and finishing.





One of my hands is holding the camera. You would hold the piece with your second hand.

You can do some limited sawing with the bench top saw horses. Apply rubber pads to the feet for a non slip hold.



The cross boards of the bench top saw horse can be any length and height you want.

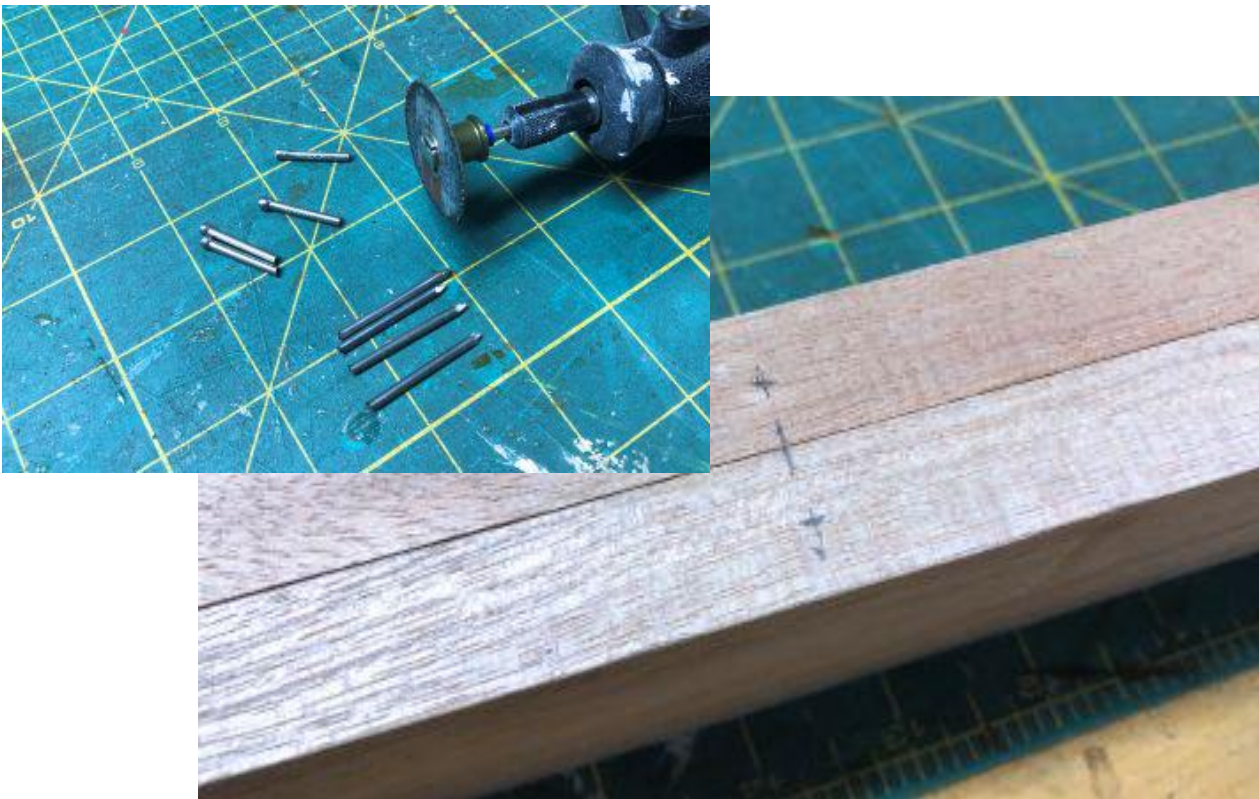
I cut mine 16" long and 2.5" tall. That fit my work bench.

Note the templates to cut the notches.





You do not need to glue the legs on. This allows you to knock down and store



You can drill as many nail holes as you need. I put two on each horse. Leave about 1/2" of the nail sticking out.
