


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
Concentric Ring Bowl.





Apply the pattern to the blank. Drill the entry holes at 18.5 degrees toward the center of the bowl.

Set the scroll saw table to 18.5 degrees. Cut each concentric ring.





Remove the pattern and they should stack in the shape below.





Glue the rings together keeping the grain lined up the way they were cut from the wood. Do not glue on the bottom yet.

Place a heavy weight on the rings and let the glue dry.






Now for the tough part. Sand the rings until you have a smooth outer and inner bowl.

Glue on the bottom and sand it flush.

Finish with your favorite finish. The bowl has mostly end grain showing so it will soak up the finish. Apply several coats.



Cut rings with the table set to 18.4 degrees



Drill entry hole at the same 18.4 degrees as you are going to set the scroll saw table.
