You also only need to print the page/s you need. After the print dialog opens look for the "Pages to Print" section. You can print the current page or a range of pages. This will help save ink by not printing the title/instruction pages.

Your source for scroll saw ready boards.




Veining with the scroll saw. If you look at the picture above you will see lines that add detail to the pattern. In scroll saw speak these are called veins.

Veins are cut with the blade. Sometimes you may wish to use a slightly thicker blade to make the veins stand out better. In this pattern I intentionally used a small #1 blade so you could see what that size blade can produce. After I completed all the cuts I used an Xacto knife to score the veins age get the dust removed. That clears the veins up and makes them more visible.
