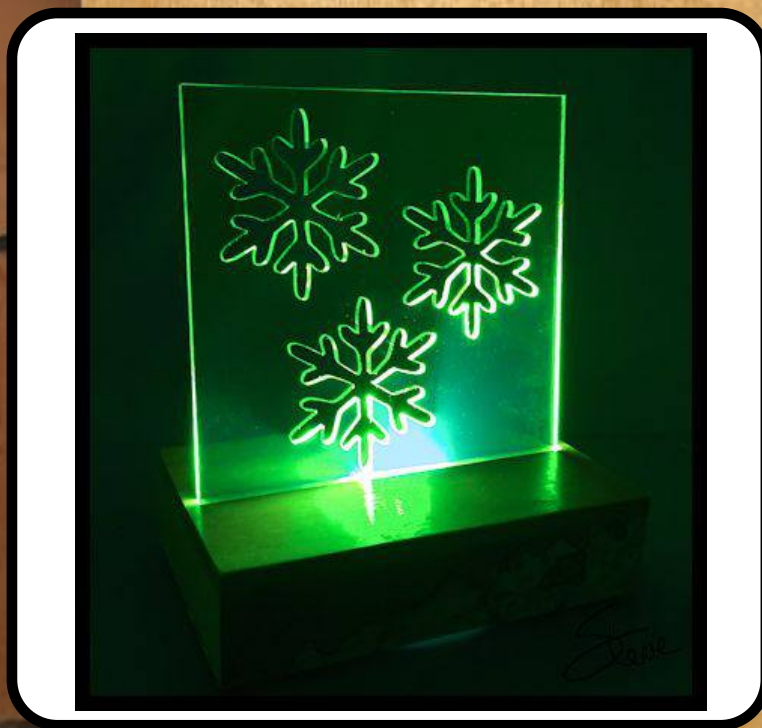

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Note to commercial print employees: I give my permission to print as many of this pattern book as your customer requires.

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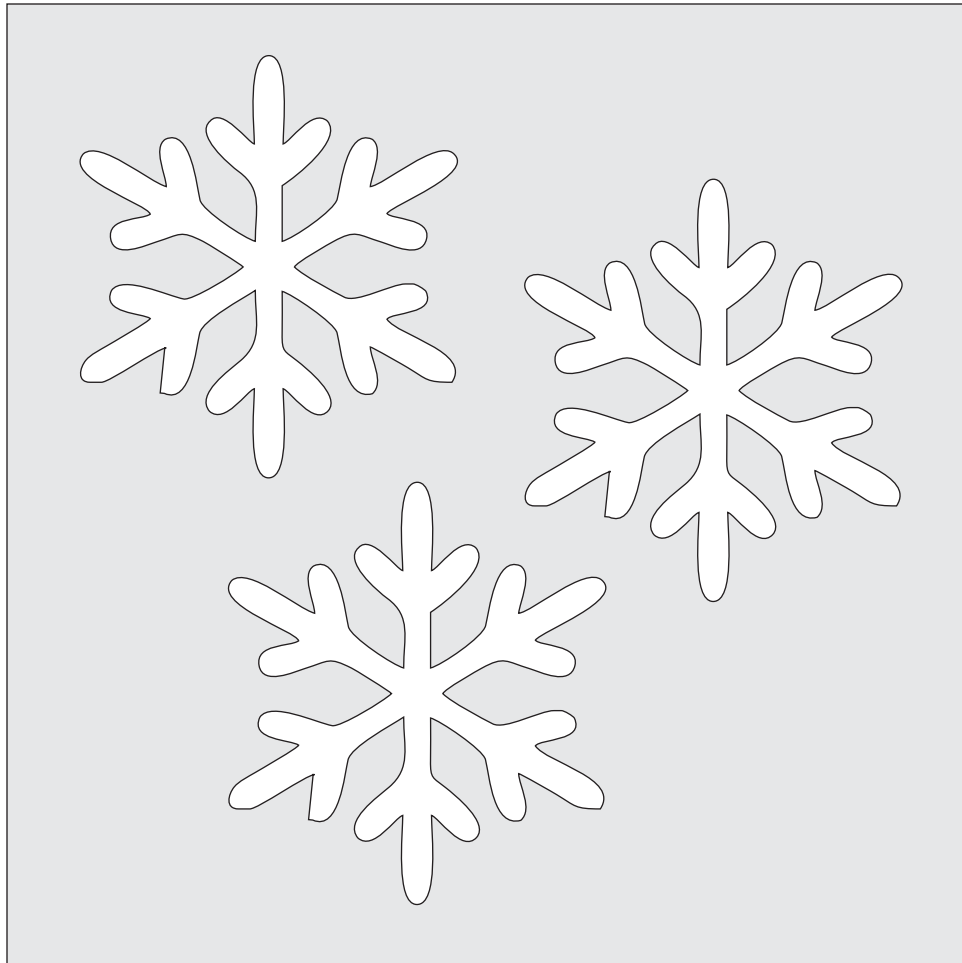
The acrylic is 1/8" thick. Leave the protective paper on both sides of the acrylic while cutting. Apply the pattern directly to the protective paper. I used a #1 scroll reverse blade. The saw was set to a medium speed.



Requires an LED puck light. The puck must be less than 3 inches in diameter and less than 1 inch tall. I bought mine in a 3 pack.

If your puck is a different size then you will need to modify the pattern.

1/8" Thick Acrylic.



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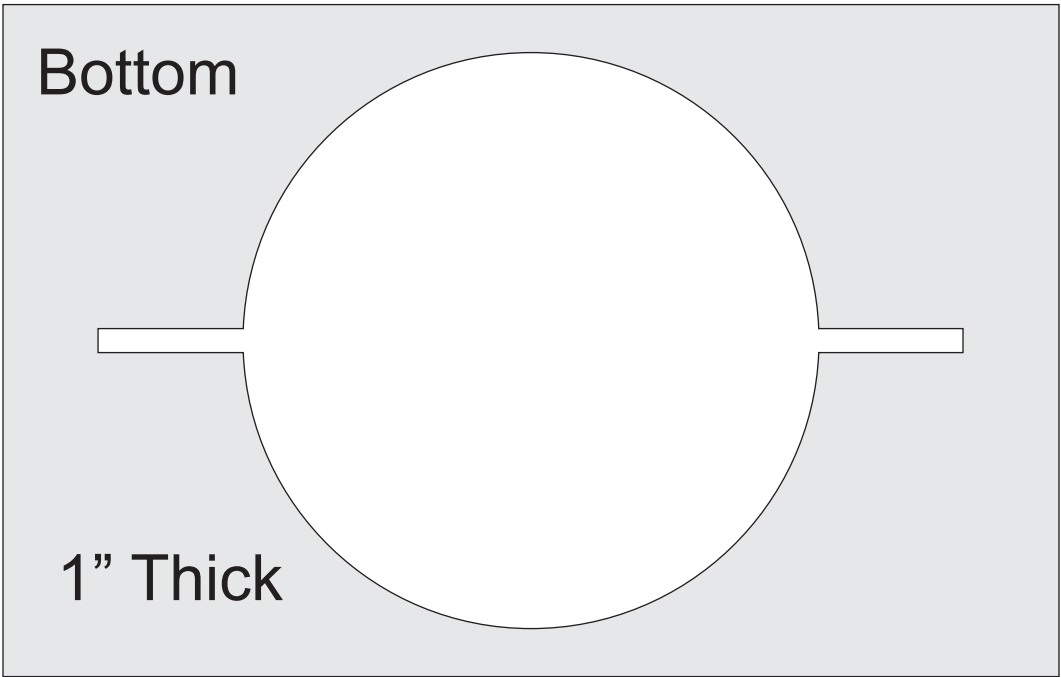


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When you glue the top to the bottom the light slots must line up.
Notice that the light slit is shorter on the bottom. This gives a shelf
for the acrylic to sit on.
