


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



Men's Initial Ring.





Apply the pattern to the 1/2" thick wood blank. Cut the ring out. Cut carefully on the interior cut so you don't change the size too much.





Apply the initial to the 1/8" thick contrasting wood and carefully cut the initial. It's kind of small so use a #1 blade. It is also a good idea to just nibble away the corners with the side of the blade. Do some sanding to clean out the inside of the ring to make it smooth and round. Don't over do it and change the size.






Glue the initial to the ring face. Notice how it over laps the ring. We are going to take care of this by sanding it flush. Notice that I rounded over the edges of the ring. That's a very important detail.

Notice how the initial has been sanded to match the angle of the ring. The better the sanding job you do the more professional the ring will look. Take your time and get it right.




1/2" Thick wood.
