When printing this pattern it is important to print it full size. When you bring up the print dialog box look in the “Page Sizing & Handling” section. Make sure the “Actual Size” is selected before you hit print.

You also only need to print the page/s you need. After the print dialog opens look for the “Pages to Print” section. You can print the current page or a range of pages. This will help save ink by not printing the title/instruction pages.

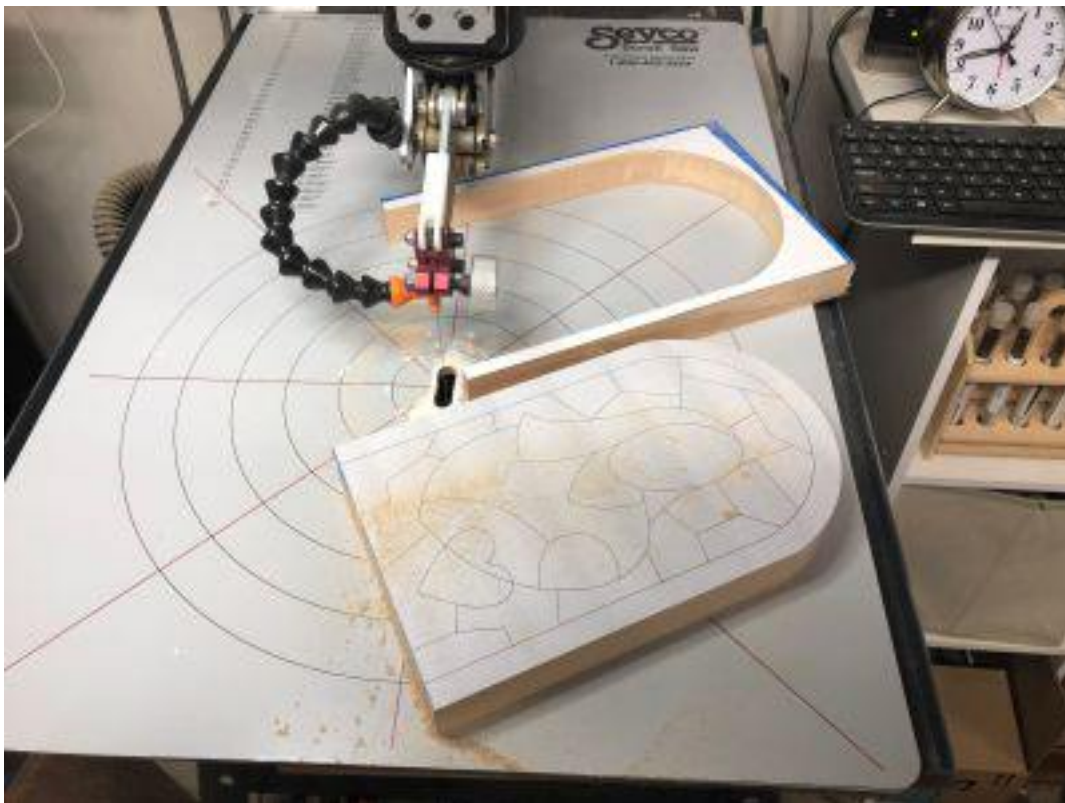
Mother and Child

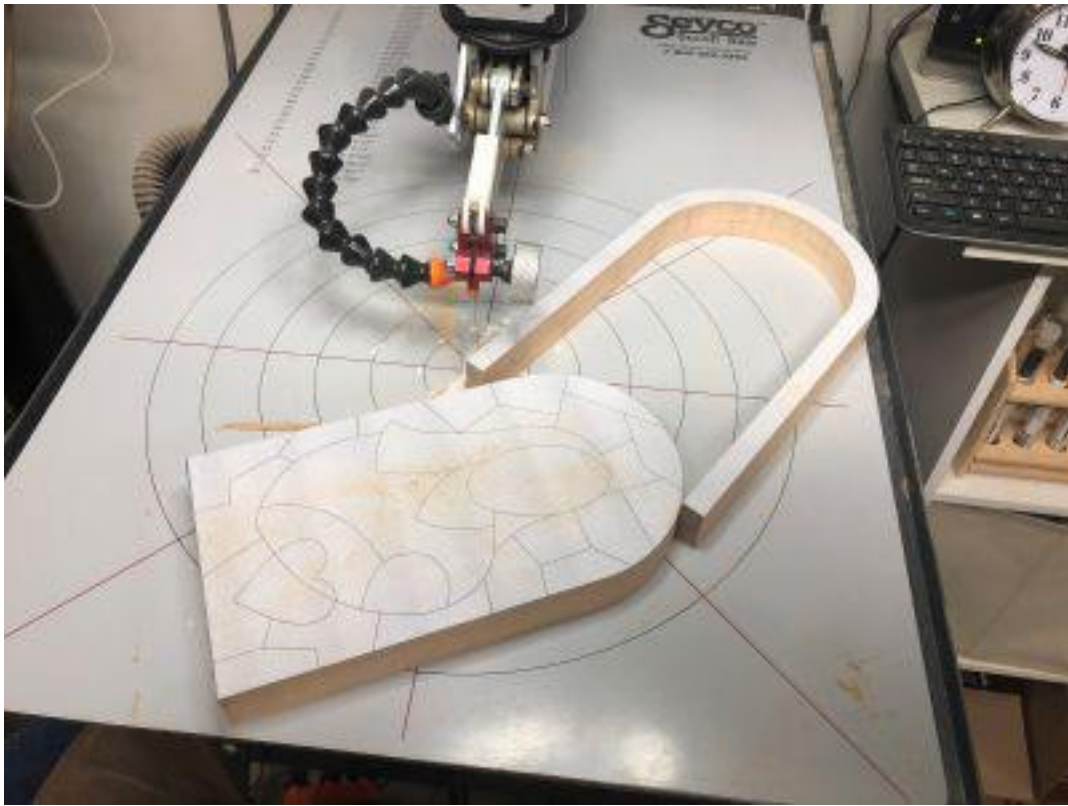






Apply the pattern to 1" thick wood. and cut away the waste around the arch.





Cur off the outside arch.

Begin cutting each piece.





As you cut out the pieces it can be a good idea to reassemble them inside the arch. If you don't want to do that then print out the pattern twice so you will have a reference to reassemble the parts.





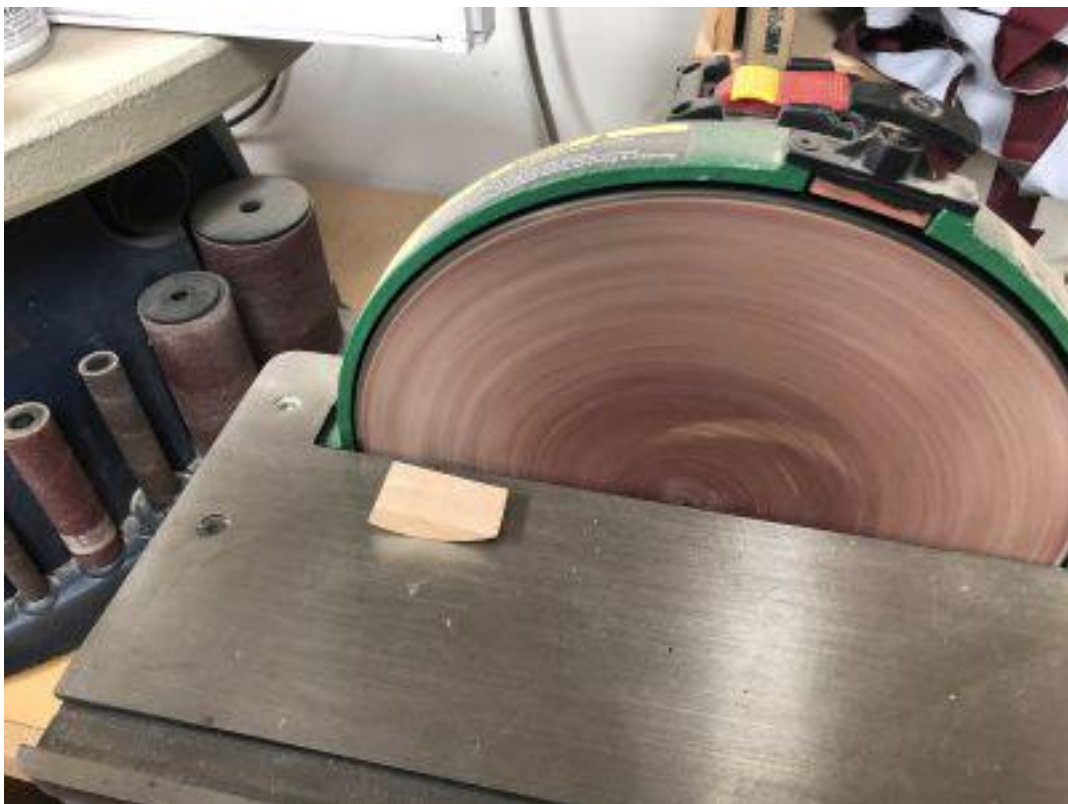
Glue the arch to the backer board. Make sure you have all the pieces inside the arch when you glue it to the backer board so they will fit later.



I marked all the pieces that will be the deepest with an X.



Remove the pattern one piece at a time and sand to the depth you need. I not only sanded them thinner I also faceted each of the background pieces.





Notice how the background pieces are lower and faceted.
Leave the mother and child to last.





All the background pieces are placed in their position.
Look over the pieces and resand any pieces that don't
look good.



Sand the mother and child to depth but don't round the pieces until they are at the correct depth. The mothers head and the babies head should be the highest parts.

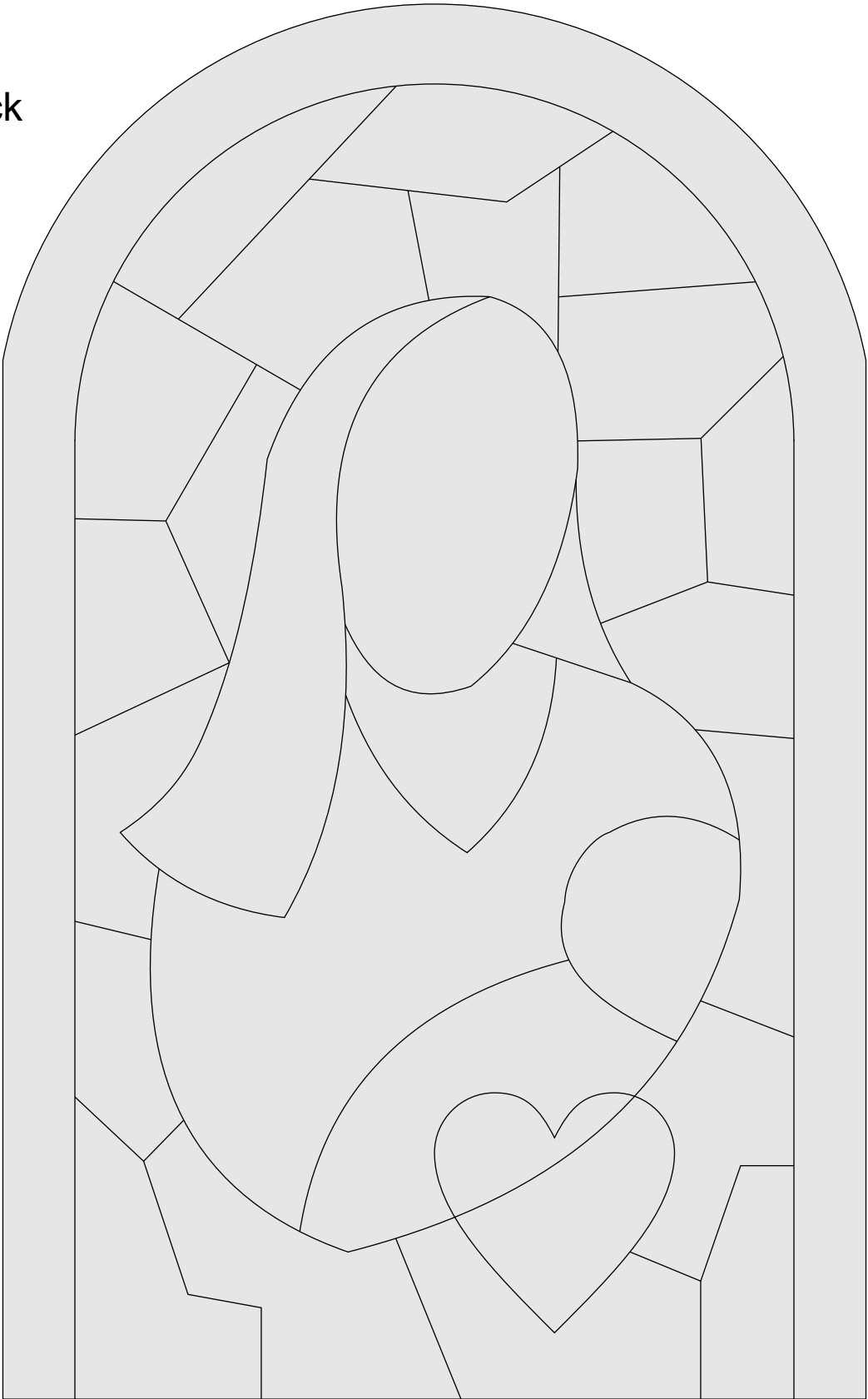



Not it's time to contour each of the mother and child pieces.



When glueing all the pieces together it is best to start on the outside and work your way to the middle. Move quickly so you can rearrange the pieces if they don't fit.
