Scroll Saw Mug



This mug is easy to cut. If you make a few mistakes cutting the circles it's no big deal because you are going to sand everything smooth after it's glued up.

Glue up the rings in sections and sand the inside as you go. after the inside is smooth glue the sections and bottom together. Sand the outside smooth. Finally sand a flat spot to mount the handle. Clue on the handle and finish.

Food safe finishes.


Any time I post a pattern that involves finishing an item used for food or drink I get the same question.

What finishes are food safe?


The answer is easier than many will have you believe. All modern day finishes are food safe once they are completely cured. There is a difference between cured and dry. It may take a few days for the finish to completely cure. Read the product instructions for curing times.

Notice the flat spot for attaching the handle. You can power sand it perfectly flat after the mug is glued up.



The mug rings can be any thickness as long as they add up to at least 5 inches tall. Use your imagination with different thicknesses and colors to make the mug your personal design.
