When printing this pattern it is important to print it full size. When you bring up the print dialog box look in the “Page Sizing & Handling” section. Make sure the “Actual Size” is selected before you hit print.

You also only need to print the page/s you need. After the print dialog opens look for the “Pages to Print” section. You can print the current page or a range of pages. This will help save ink by not printing the title/instruction pages.

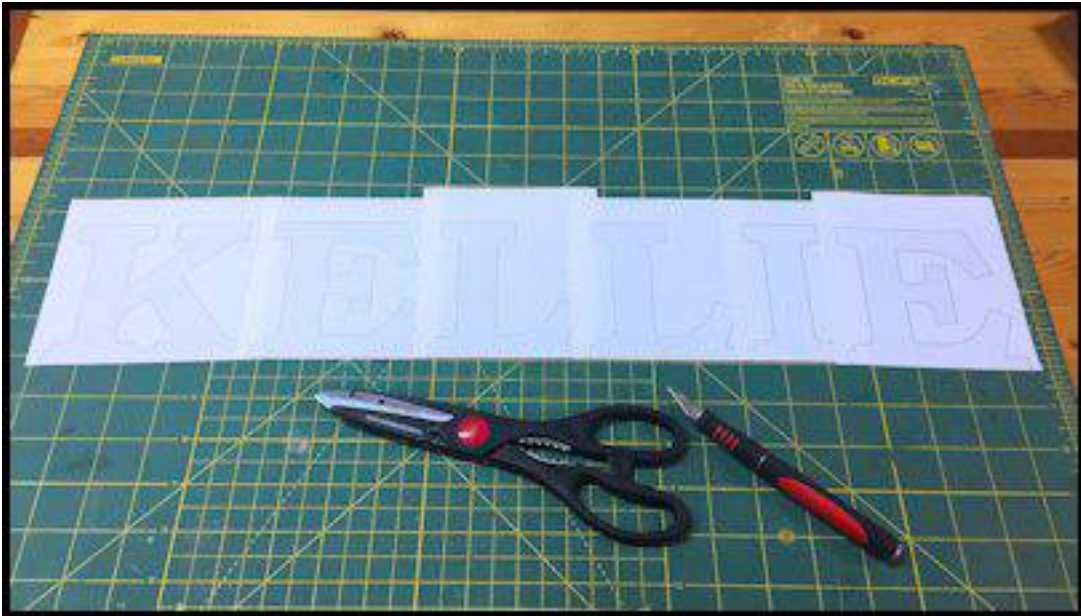
This pattern book contains all 26 letters and 10 numbers. Each comes in two sizes. The large set is show first then the small set.

Each letter and number is on a base designed to make the spacing of the letters correct. You can cut each letter individually or make one complete pattern by applying the letter to one long board.

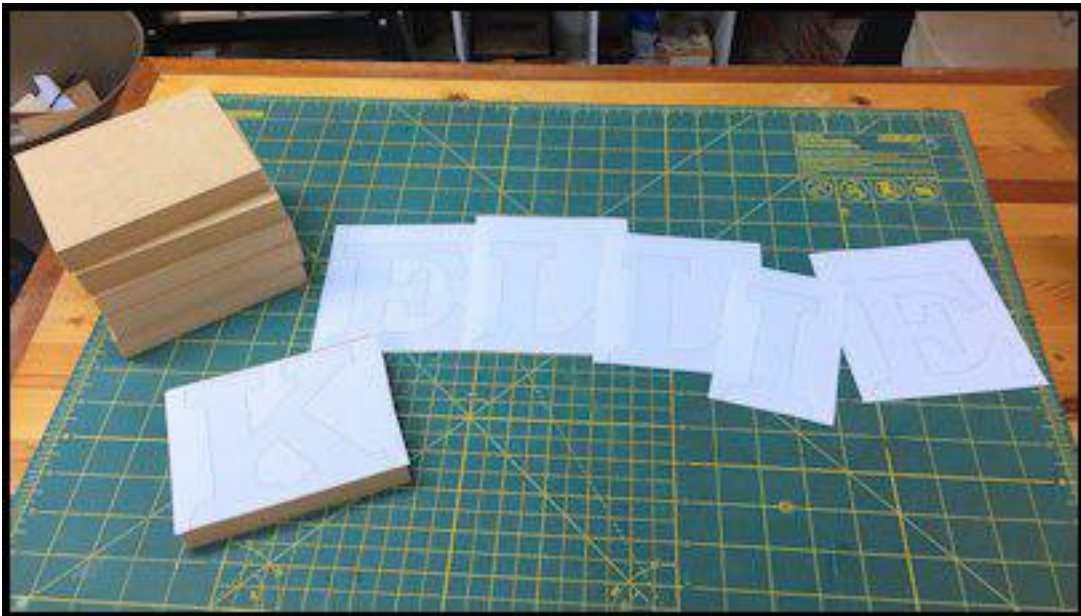


This could be a nice demonstration at a craft show to make a little extra money. Take orders for names and cut the letters onsite. Each letter can be cut in under two minutes. \$1.50 per letter would be a good starting price.

Cut a large group of MDF blanks before the show.



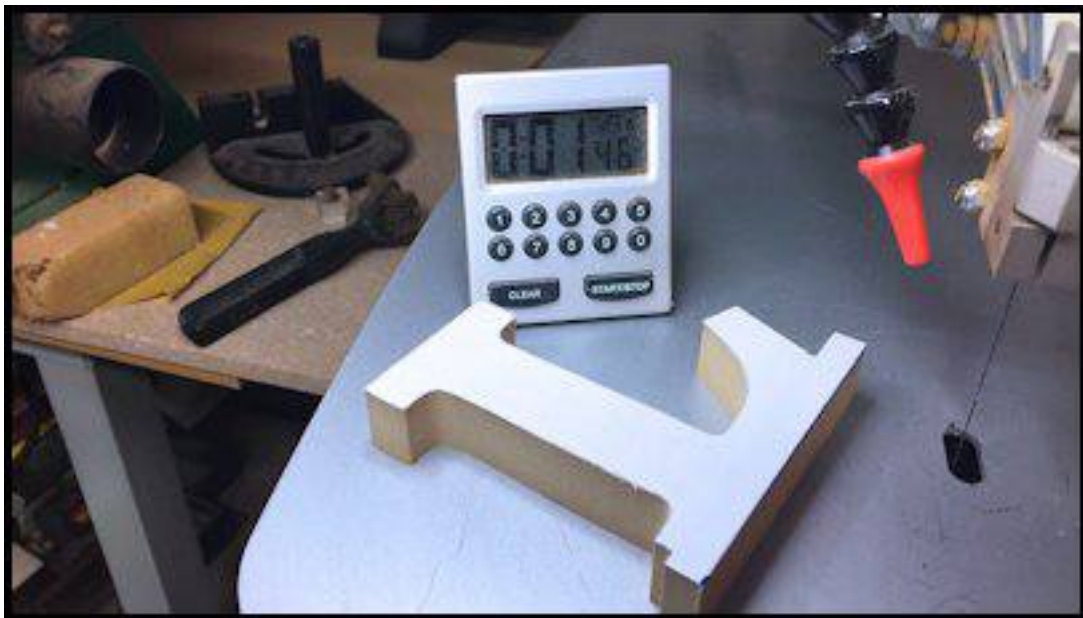
Cut the patterns. Make sure you cut across the bottom line of the letters. We will line up the bottom of the letter with the bottom of the wood blank.  
Cut enough wood blanks for each letter or number.





Apply blue painters take across each wood blank.  
Apply the patterns with spray adhesive lining up the  
bottom of the letter with the bottom of the blank.

As a reference for pricing I timed the cut. Each letter can  
be cut in two minutes give or take depending on the letter.



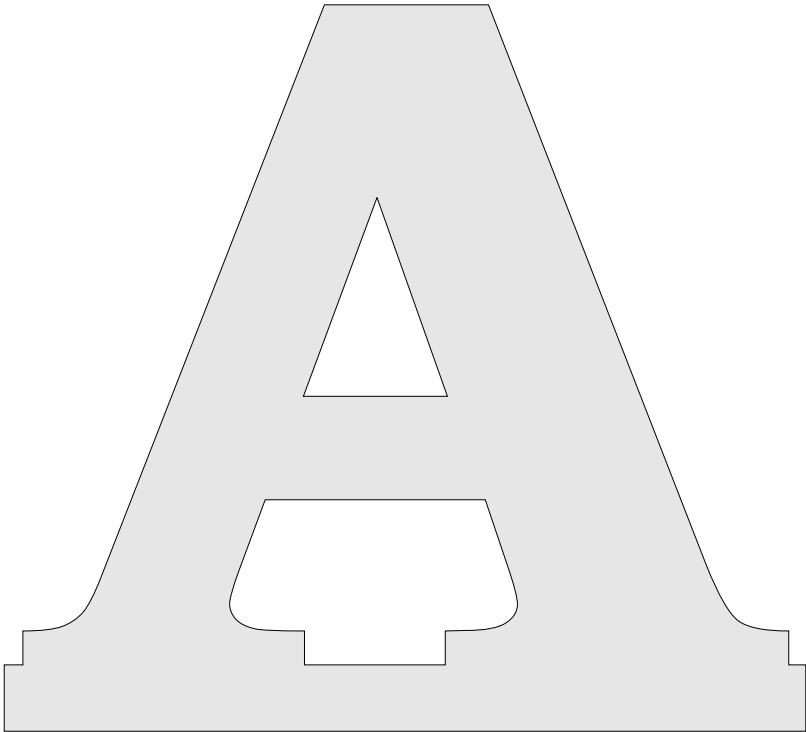
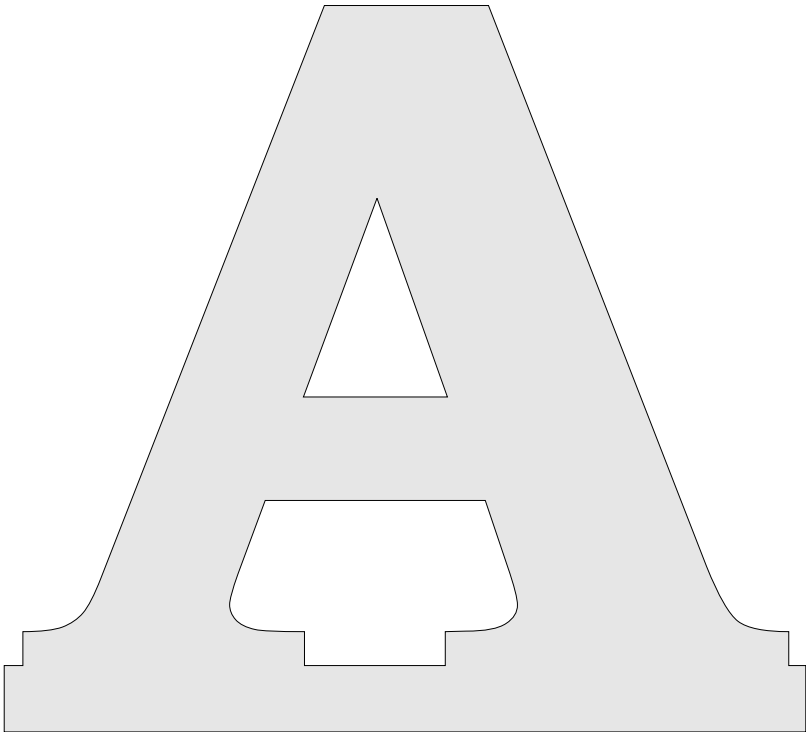




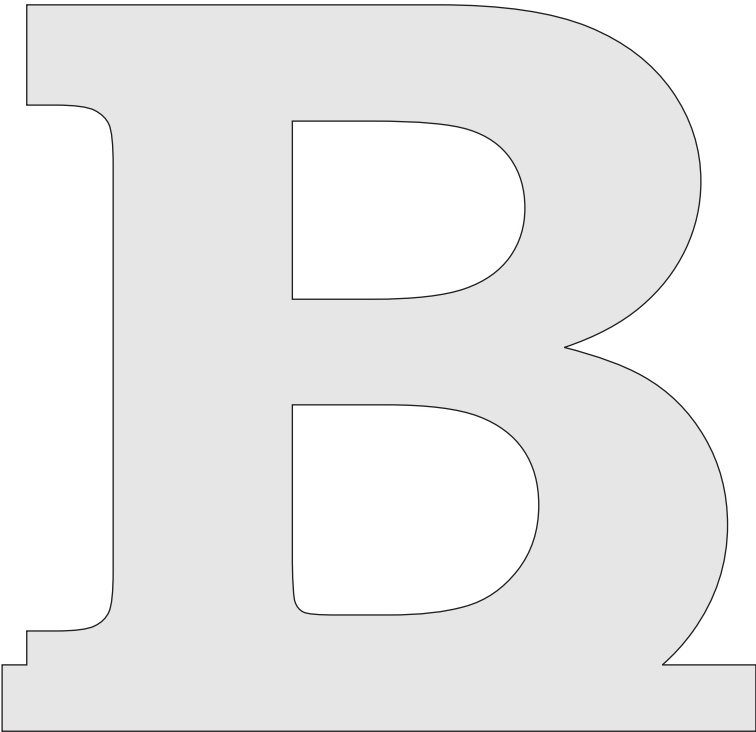
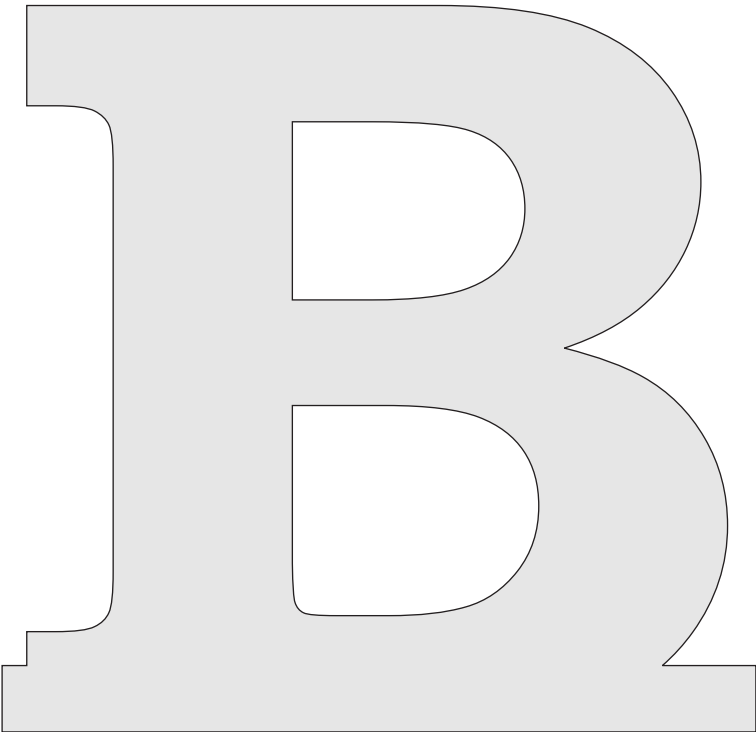
Do some lite sanding to prepare for paint.
