#### National Dog Day Jigsaw Puzzle Template








Print the Image on high-quality photo paper. Print the template on regular printer paper.

Cut two blanks from Baltic birch plywood. 1. 8" X 6" X 1/4" For the puzzle 2. 8" X 6" X 1/8" For the template.





Cut out the image using the crop marks. Use spray adhesive to glue the image to the 1/4" BB ply. Follow the directions on the can for a permanent bond



Place the 1/8" BB ply over the board with the image. Wrap both boards in blue painters tape or clear packing tape.

Glue the cut out puzzle template to the stack, on top of the 1/8" BB ply.





Use a very small blade to cut the puzzle pieces. A #2/0 will work or you can but specific puzzle cutting blades.

Cut each pieces and remove the waste board to reveal the puzzle piece.






Lightly sand the back of each piece to remove the tear out.

Reassemble the puzzle are you cut the pieces.

I spray the finished puzzle with spray acrylic for protection.
