


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Small Round Vase










Apply the patterns to the wood blank.

Drill the interior entry holes on the front piece.





All the interior holes are drilled.

Cut the center parts of the vase first.





Glue the two center parts together and clamp.

Try to glue them up as flush as possible. We will sand them flush at the end.





While the center parts cure you can cut the front and back.





Glue the front and back to the center glue-up.

After the glue cures sand everything flush.







you can see the difference after everything is sanded.

Take your time ans get it sanded well.





Round-over all both sides. I did not round-over the bottom.





1/4" Thick





If you are comfortable cutting very thick wood then you can cut one center section from 2" thick wood.
