When printing this pattern it is important to print it full size. When you bring up the print dialog box look in the “Page Sizing & Handling” section. Make sure the “Actual Size” is selected before you hit print.

You also only need to print the page/s you need. After the print dialog opens look for the “Pages to Print” section. You can print the current page or a range of pages. This will help save ink by not printing the title/instruction pages.

Printing Instructions



Snowman Clock



Requires a 2 3/4" Clock Insert



For this project we will replace the original clock dial. Print the included new dial on photo paper.

Disassemble the clock insert carefully. Remove the bezel and the hands. You don't need to remove the original clock dial.





Cut the outside of the dial with sharp scissors.

I use an Exacto knife to cut an X in the center of the dial. I then remove the pieces by carefully cutting along the circle.

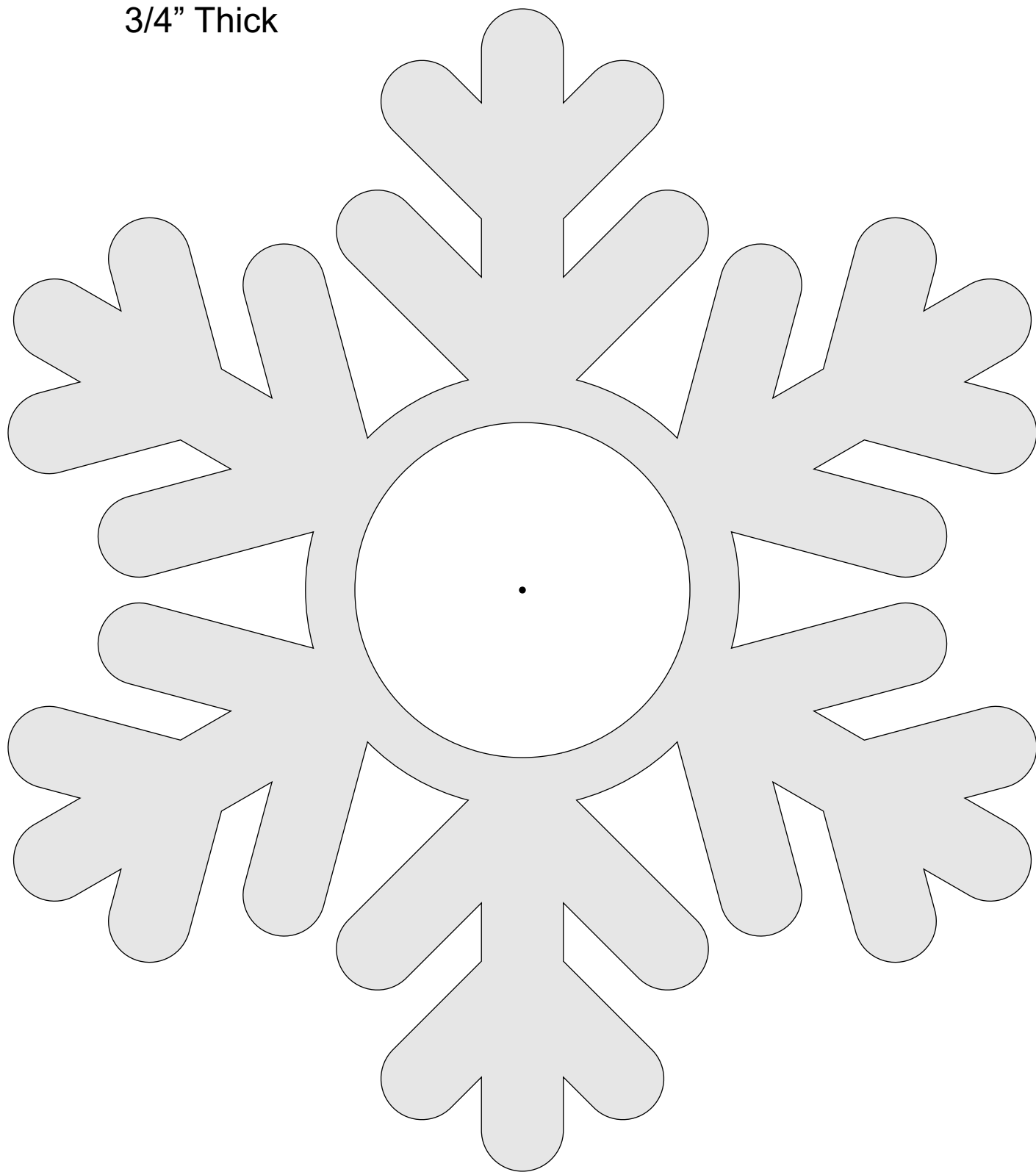




Use a small amount of spray adhesive on the back of the new dial. Apply it over the original dial and reassemble the clock.
