
Refrigerator Magnet Picture Frame(6" X 4" photos)



Picture behind 1/8" acrylic sheet


Use two, three or four magnets depending on how well they hold.

Acrylic cuts easily on a table saw.
You can cut it on the scroll saw but
it works best to sandwich the acrylic
between two sheets of 1/8" Baltic birch plywood.
